Policy Committee Charter - DRAFT



Committee Purpose:

The committee is responsible for ensuring policies and their outcomes support the mission, and strategic goals of the organization. The committee is responsible for assisting the board in: (1) translating governmental mandates and legislation into meaningful (organizational/board?) policy to affect program and services. (2) making strategic decisions that support the mission and ensure the mission is reflected in how policy is drafted, implemented, or supported (3) soliciting public comment and input into plans and policies, (4) identifying, evaluating and reviewing social, political and environmental trends that affect business activities and performance, and (5) reviewing proposed management policies and related action to adjust to trends and impacts to more effectively achieve the Exchange's long-term business goals.

The policy committee's specific accountabilities include:

- Recommending policies and strategies that maintain and improve the mission to increase access, affordability and choice to individuals, families and small businesses purchasing health insurance in Colorado.
- Reviewing and recommending policies.
- Reviewing and recommending the budget implications of policies OR reviewing the financial aspects of major policies and new programs and services
- Monitoring the implementation of policies against the intended and unintended consequences.
- Monitor state and federal health care policy and its impact on Exchange policies and strategies.
- Gather public input

The intent of the Committee is to address the effect(s) public policy may have on the operations of the Marketplace and how the Marketplace influences public policy and to make strategic recommendations for board policy. The Committee is not intended to review or approve tactical, business policies and procedures that the Marketplace uses for its day-to-day operations.
