Proposed Action:

Board Approval to Contract with Assistant Network sites for Fiscal Year 2018.

Summary:

Requesting approval to proceed with the contracting with the attached list of assistant network grantees. Since Federal funds may be used to fund a portion of this program we are seeking Board approval to procure the services for those grantees that will receive funds in excess of \$150,000.

Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommends the approval of the funding of these sites.

Procurement Compliance:

Procurement Exceeds \$150,000 (Federal)/\$250,000 (non-Federal) threshold: Some of the grantees will receive funds exceeding \$150,000.

Procurement/Business Initiative is necessary or advisable: Yes – this is an ongoing successful program that supports the outreach and enrollment efforts of the organization.

Type of procurement vehicle: Individual Contracts with each grantee

Need for RFP,RFI,RFS or similar: No, The organizations selected to participate had previous administrative experience with C4HCO and over three years of experience with facilitating enrollments through the C4HCO Marketplace.

Funding Source:

The Colorado Health Foundation has approved and will be providing up to \$2,075,000 to support the assistant network sites. Pending further approvals by CMS, Federal funds may be used for a portion of these expenditures if allowable.



^{*}Colorado Health Institute, APTC 2016 EBNE Analysis; May 4, 2016. Colorado Non-Elderly Population Eligible for APTCs but Not Insured, 2016. This data was derived from CHI estimates of non-elderly Coloradans (ages 0 to 64) who are eligible but not enrolled (EBNE) in a Connect for Health Colorado plan using Advanced Premium Tax Credits (APTCs). The values are up to date as of the end of the 2016 open enrollment period (OE3), though additional enrollees may sign up throughout the year if they have a qualifying life event. "APTC Uninsured EBNE" only includes Coloradans who are uninsured. Note: CHI provided Connect for Health Colorado a zip-code analysis which was modified to provide a geographic "crosswalk" of County-level estimates.
