Training Colorado Counties

- Total number of in-person training hours delivered: 27
- Total number of individuals trained in-person and virtually: 2998
- Average percent enrollment change from OE5 to OE6 in counties that participated in in-person trainings: 10% increase

HCPF County Incentives Program

The Department of Health Care Policy and Financing, in conjunction with county partners, identifies goals, benchmarks, and deliverables that are tied to county performance including training hours. If counties meet the requirements of the incentives, they are paid additional funds up to their current local share.
