The bill requires health care sharing ministries to: Report specified information to the commissioner of insurance (commissioner) regarding its operations, financial statements, membership, and medical bills submitted, paid, and denied; Provide certain disclosures on its website, in marketing materials, and to potential members; and Respond to requests for payment of medical expenses from health care providers within a period specified by the commissioner by rule. <u>SB 005</u>	Concerning a restructuring of the payment of cost-sharing amounts owed by certain covered persons.	This bill establishes a Cost Sharing Study by a third party accounting firm. This study will evaluate all out of pocket data from 2014 through 2020. SB20-043	Out-of-network Provider Reimbursement Rate	This bill is correcting a previous statutes reimbursement rate. HB 19-1174 went into effect on January 1, 2020. It stated the payment schedule incorrectly. This current bill indicated that that reimbursement rate for an out of network provider who is providing covered or emergency services, in an in-network facility. The greater of 110% of the carrier's median in network rate or in the sixtieth percentile of an in-network rate for the same service in that geographic area during the prior year. The correction is the percentage going from 105% to 110% and median into the 60th percentile. If passed this will go into effect immediately.	Rep. D. Valdez	Sen J. HB20-1160	Drug Price Transparency Insurance Premium Reductions	Concerning measures to reduce health care costs related to prescription drug prices, and, in connection therewith, creating the "Colorado Prescription Drug Price Transparency Act of 2020" to require health insurers, prescription drug manufacturers, pharmacy benefit management firms, and nonprofit organizations to report specified information about the costs of prescription drugs to the commissioner of insurance and to direct the commissioner to analyze the information and submit a report regarding the effects of prescription drug costs on health insurance premiums; and requiring health insurers to reduce insurance premiums to adjust for rebates the insurers receive for prescription drugs.
