Guiding Principles: Ranking Activity

- 1. Accuracy of Information
- 2. Expand ability to explore plans
- 3. Maximize Financial Assistance Available
- 4. Increase Health Literacy



- NABIP/Broker Perspective:
 - Major changes to plan display could create customer confusion
 - How do we define value-based shopping?
 - There is no one size fits all approach to insurance
 - It is important to avoid a display that suppresses less costly plans



- Advocate Perspective:
 - Colorado Option plans are higher quality and the only plans developed with community input via the stakeholder process
 - Offers important peri-natal services
 - Enrollment in Colorado Option plans brings in pass-through funding to the Health Insurance Affordability Enterprise
 - Expecting customers to find these plans themselves creates burden on the customer, therefore it is important to make sure customers can easily identify these plans

- Division of Insurance Perspective:
 - DOI and bill sponsors remain open to conversation on the legislation
 - There are two key goals- strengthen the Colorado Option program, and strengthen DOI's ability to implement and enforce
 - Wants to make sure these plans are easily identifiable
 - Want to make sure its easy for consumers to do an apples to apples comparison of Colorado Option plans



- Colorado Association of Health Plans Perspective:
 - Value is subjective and different for each customer
 - Seeking changes related to value
 - If plan display advantages Colorado Option plans over others, Connect for Health Colorado is limiting competition in the marketplace
 - Wants to see a stakeholder process for Connect for Health Colorado for implementation



1224 Stakeholder Forum and Guiding Principles

- Full group had a chance to react to each presentation, and was encouraged to apply the guiding principles in their thinking
- Key area of consensus: making clear what Colorado Option plans are speaks to guiding principles of accuracy of information and ability to explore different plans
- Area for further discussion: plan display needs as identified by customer research and surveys
