

# Health Insurance Eligibility for DACA Recipients







#### Issue

Out of nearly 580,000 Deferred Action for **Childhood Arrivals** (DACA) recipients in the United States, around 34 percent are uninsured.



#### Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services proposed a rule

To consider DACA recipients as "lawfully present" solely to allow them to enroll in affordable health insurance programs aligning with the Affordable Care Act's goal of improving healthcare access.



# **Enrollment Options**

Under the proposed rule, DACA recipients can enroll in:

- Qualified Health Plans via Marketplace and receive financial aid through premium tax credits, advance payments of the premium tax credit, and costsharing reductions based on their eligibility.
- Basic Health Program (BHP- New York and Minnesota)
- Medicaid and Children's Health Insurance Program;
   only for pregnant people or recipients under 19.

### Proposed Bill Timeline 2023

June 23

November 1

November 1-January 15

60 Days (Before or after November 1)

Public comments are due

- Proposed start date for rule
- Open enrollment period; Recipients can shop and enroll in an insurance plan
- Special **Enrollment** Period (SEP); Recipients are eligible as they receive DACA status or other QLCEs

#### **Estimated Enrollments**

Based on a survey, the Department of Health & Human Services notes that under the proposed rule, 129,000 nationwide DACA recipients will be able to enroll in a health plan comprising:

112,000 Marketplace enrollees

13,000 Medicaid enrollees

4,000 BHP enrollees
